Building a Multistakeholder Digital Future

PROGRAMME

CONTEXT

As a multistakeholder platform, the United Nations (UN) Internet Governance Forum (IGF) brings together yearly over 9,000 participants and facilitates the discussion of public policy issues pertaining to digital technologies on and off the Internet.

This year, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is hosting the 19th Internet Governance Forum (IGF 2024) to be held from 15 to 19 December in Riyadh under the overarching theme ***Building our Multistakeholder Digital Future***. With over 300 scheduled sessions, the programme will be structured around the following four sub-themes:

- Harnessing innovation and balancing risks in the digital space
- Enhancing the digital contribution to peace, development and sustainability
- Advancing human rights and inclusion in the digital age
- Improving digital governance for the Internet We Want.

Since 2019, the IGF actively involves members of parliaments (MPs) from around the world and provides an important platform for parliamentarians to exchange views on digital policy issues and to interact with leading experts, including from the private sector, civil society, technical community and government. Through a dedicated Parliamentary Track and in collaboration with numerous IGF partners, the Forum organizes a set of activities in the lead-up to and at the annual IGF meeting.

The Parliamentary Track at IGF 2024 is jointly organized by the Internet Governance Forum Secretariat from the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA), the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU), and the Shura Council of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. The IGF welcomes the participation of any interested member of parliament and parliamentary staff, especially those working in relevant parliamentary committees, and parliamentarians who work on digital affairs and Internet policy issues.

TOPICAL OVERVIEW

Digital transformation, including the rapid development of information and communications technologies (ICT) and global interconnectedness, has great potential to accelerate human development and bridge digital divides, among and within countries. Indeed, the pace of technological change is unprecedentedly fast, fundamentally transforming our common future. In support of the implementation and achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030, the contribution of parliaments at the national, regional and global levels, including through multistakeholder partnerships, is vital for the roadmap to a digitally transformed future.



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In this era of rapid change in which technology has become increasingly powerful, partnerships and collaborating ecosystems ensure an effective, representative and inclusive transformation. These collaborations should encompass national parliaments as key legislative bodies that can address the impact, opportunities and challenges societies are facing in the digital age. Members of parliament can ensure that the digital transformation journey is not only successful but also human-centered, inclusive, sustainable and ethical.

Under the overarching theme of the IGF 2024 *Building our Multistakeholder Digital Future*, the objective of the Parliamentary Track is to strengthen digital cooperation, including by:

- Facilitating inter-parliamentary and multistakeholder dialogue on the role of science, technology, and innovation in the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (2030 Agenda).
- Discussing the role of parliaments in creating an inclusive, risk-free, ethical and sustainable digital space.
- Identifying parliamentary priorities in digital affairs and Internet policy issues, and ways to build capacity to take action on these priorities.
- Building dialogue between parliamentarians and the private sector, the technical community and civil society, including youth, on challenges and potential solutions related to digital transformation.

OUTPUT

During the interactive sessions, parliamentarians are invited to engage with experts, share their views, and exchange opinions and experience on existing or potential legislative solutions. The key messages that emerge from discussions at the IGF Parliamentary Track will be captured in a formal, action-oriented document as one of the outputs from IGF 2024.

Members of parliament will be concretely informed on how to get involved and contribute to the shaping of our common digital future.

An open exchange.</p> <p>The Internet Governance Forum is a year-round process that has a network of over 170 National and Regional IGF initiatives (NRIs). These initiatives involve local actors, including members of parliament. In 2024, regional Parliamentary Tracks were organized in Africa, Central Asia, and in Latin America and the Caribbean.</p> <p>This session will report back on the most pressing digital issues that emerged from the regional Parliamentary Tracks as a starting point for discussion on the priorities for parliaments in the coming year. These priorities will guide the discussions and inform the outputs from the global IGF Parliamentary Track.</p>

09:30–10:15 <i>Parliamentary Track Room</i>	<p>[Parliamentary Session 3] Researching at the frontier: Insights from the private sector in developing large-scale AI systems</p> <p>Innovation is a crucial element of societal development. As the core driver for modern existence, it addresses social needs and resolves collective problems, by contributing, among others, to economic growth, job creation and poverty reduction. Innovation can, however, disrupt markets. With the rapid development and adoption of artificial intelligence (AI), especially generative AI, societies are confronted with new risks and challenges.</p> <p>During this session, parliamentarians will interact with representatives of a private sector company that develops large-scale AI systems and researches the safety and societal impact of its models as the technology becomes increasingly advanced and capable.</p>
10:15–11:00 <i>Parliamentary Track Room</i>	<p>[Parliamentary Session 4] Fostering inclusive digital innovation and transformation</p> <p>Digital transformation offers a wide range of benefits, driving innovation, growth and access to global markets and education. However, the accelerated development and integration of digital technologies across societies risk exacerbating inequalities and infringing on rights. It is vital to ensure that opportunities arising from the digital transformation journey, starting with technological innovation, are accessible to all, including to marginalized and disadvantaged groups. Mindful of the central, transformative promise of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (2030 Agenda) to “leave no one behind”, this session delves into policy practices that promote inclusive digital innovation and transformation.</p>

Indeed, the features that make the Internet powerful can also lead to online harms that impact societies, particularly vulnerable and marginalized groups. Members of parliament have been given the delicate responsibility of developing effective legislation that enhances safety online, while balancing innovation and risks in the digital space. The global reach and the nature of these risks require collaboration across sectors and, in some cases, across international borders. This session brings parliamentarians together with different actors from the digital community to showcase successful collaborative approaches that effectively and sustainably address online harms.</p>

Through a dedicated IGF Youth Track, a global network of young people active in the digital sphere has organized workshops across all regions around the theme <i>Empowering young leaders for trusted AI</i>, which will culminate in the IGF 2024 Global Youth Summit.
